# Measuring the Impact of Natural Disaster on the Homelessness Response System

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#### Community Profile: Ventura County, CA

- Population 839,620, 10 cities +unincorporated area
- Poverty rate: 9.8%
- Fair Market Rent: 1 bedroom \$1,326
- Top 10 cost burdened regions of the country (High cost/low vacancy)
- 53% of county's landmass is National Forest
- Community prides itself on opposing urban sprawl, protecting agricultural land and open space

#### **Thomas Fire Ventura County**

- Started December 4, 2017
- Wind-driven
- Fully contained January 20, 2018
- 281,893 acres burned
- Total # residents evacuated: 90,000+



















#### Approaching the Results – Ventura County, CA

- Ventura had a small sample of fire victims to work with
  - Less likely to give an accurate representation of population
- Only one community
- Region specific questions included
- Best approach was to highlight the fire victims amongst the total count
- Data was not compared against 2010 US Census Data



#### **Approaching the Results - Texas**


- Texas had a large sample of hurricane evacuees
- Eight different communities to compare results amongst one another
- Region specific questions had to be excluded
- Because of sample size, best approach was to only focus on hurricane evacuees and compare the impact they had on each region.
- Demographics could be compared to 2010 US Census data for the state of Texas.



#### The Technical Framework


- Custom Point in Time survey created for each region
  - Asked clients if they were homeless as a result of the natural disaster
  - Some regions opted in to asking additional questions as well
- Surveys collected through mobile tech
- Data cleanup executed in regional command center
- Data exported from command center into a common CSV format
- Data exports from each region then combined together into one master file
- Master CSV file, 2010 Census data, and reformatted client location files were then imported into Tableau Public where dashboards were created

#### The Technical Framework



#### **Data Quality**

- Some clients reported conflicting information
  - Age (i.e. date of birth, age, or age range not matching one another)
  - Homeless as result of natural disaster response not matching origin location
- Observation tallies do not collect all the necessary information



#### **Unsheltered Weighting Factor**

- Not all clients were interviewed directly
- Some regions had a large number of observation tallies
- Formula below was used to extrapolate responses for the observation tallies:

Unsheltered Surveys + Observation Tallies
Unsheltered Surveys

Weighting factor could then be used to create an estimated total number of victims

Evacuees Counted: 96

5.02% of Count

Unsheltered Weighting Factor: 3.143

Estimated Total Evacuees: 301.7





- TX BoS CoC covers 215 of Texas' 254 counties (86% of Texas's land mass)
















# Next Steps – Using data for preparedness, response, recovery

- PIT data collected from Evacuees will be used inform GLO of needs to address under CDBG-DR action plan.
- Data collected through this effort has sparked renewed interest in creating a data warehouse.
- Data warehouse would help improved speed and efficiency of disaster response.
- Data collection results and planning will aid in the creation of a Disaster Housing Strategy.
- Better outcomes for evacuees and for affected communities will be realized with greater access to data – efforts like this will get us there.
